## HIGHLIGHTS OF BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2022 ZOOM 6:30PM

- The Aging in Place Committee has a list of resources available for seniors which they would like distributed as a door drop. The accessible computer has been purchased with some of the \$3,000 provincial grant received late last year. When the committee has sourced adaptability software and peripherals, the computer will be set up in the library. A grant application has been submitted to the federal government's program New Horizons for Seniors, seeking \$20,000 to install automatic door openers. Jo-Anne Kennedy and Colleen Tripp stepped down from their positions as Vice Chair and Chair of the committee due to Board responsibilities; Ava Rubin is the new Chair.
- Some members of the Board and Staff will be taking Henry Wai's Compassionate Communication workshop in March.
- Merle Mattison has resigned from the Membership Selection Committee.
- The library will be re-opening soon.
- The CDC would like to hold a Spring Fling on April 8<sup>th</sup> or 22<sup>nd</sup>, similar to the February Blahs event, non-alcoholic, with games etc. COVID restrictions will be strictly followed. The CDC would also like to hold a Lawn Sale on June 4<sup>th</sup>, with a rain date of June 5<sup>th</sup>, with a charge of \$5/table to register. The committee will submit a written proposal for both events to the Board.
- The first Member Info Session was held on January 29<sup>th</sup>, facilitated by Kendall Stephens, Jacques Coetzer, and Gord Autterson. As a result, the heating in 31 Alexander can at times become slightly inadequate. The hot water in 31 is working. Orders have been placed for missing parts but we have no lead time as to expected arrival due to supply chain issues. In the meantime, maintenance is looking into whatever solutions may be available to fix heat in 31 and hot water in 51 and 484 lower.
- The President pointed out that all notices coming from the office to the members should be dated so members can tell if they're reading current information. It was requested by a board member that the day of the week always be included in dating of notices because that is a common reference point for members.
- Members are requested to go to City Park's website and click on 'Urgent Call To Action – Fix the Formula 4 Co-ops' and write a letter. - The Board will be setting up a sub-committee that will be making the necessary amendments to our by-laws so that we are in compliance with the Housing Services Act. When the project is complete, the Board will present the proposed amendments to the Members for adoption.
